BIO – Drs. Lynn and Sharon Fogleman



MISSIONARY SPEAKER

M. Lynn Fogleman grew up in Kansas, the son of a United Methodist pastor, and graduated from the University of Kansas for undergraduate and medical school. He completed a Family Practice residency in Davenport, Iowa. Sharon Goodwin Fogleman grew up in Iowa and graduated from Cornell College for undergraduate and the University of Iowa with a medical degree. She completed a Family Practice residency in Waterloo, Iowa. Lynn and Sharon met on a two week medical mission trip to the Dominican Republic during medical school years. They married in 1985 as they answered the call from God to serve internationally through the General Board of Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church.

After 10 years of medical missionary service at Maua Methodist Hospital in Kenya, and 14 years at Red Bird Clinic in Beverly, Kentucky, these two United Methodist family physicians have felt God's call to serve as cross-cultural witnesses for Jesus Christ in the new country of South Sudan under the auspices of The Mission Society. Lynn and Sharon will be involved in helping to train Sudanese community health workers how to teach villagers basic health practices in a land where there is minimal health care available now. "We expect these village health workers to continue to pass on these life-saving skills for years to come. Through Community Health Evangelism, we pray that the Lord will call many disciples of Jesus – the true healer, and that the new disciples may become disciple-makers themselves." The Foglemans anticipate working alongside current GBGM missionaries as they minister to communities with United Methodist Churches.

The Foglemans have 3 grown children: Kurt, 24, serving with the Peace Corps in Ukraine; Mark, 22, in his fourth year at the University of Kentucky in civil engineering; and Joella, 20, in cosmetology school in Louisville, KY and mother to Zari, their first grandchild!
